






Gospel Acclamation: (cantor/all)

Gospel Reading Before the Gospel, the Priest/Deacon says, "The Lord be with you," and all respond: And with your spirit.

Before Priest/Deacon says, "A reading from the Holy Gospel according to N"., and all respond: Glory to you, O Lord.

After the Gospel reading, the Priest/Deacon says, "The Gospel of the Lord," and all respond: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Homily



Profession of Faith: (Nicene Creed)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. (stand) For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

> I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

Priest: The Lord be with you. All: **And with your spirit.** Priest: Lift up your hearts. All: **We Lift them up to the Lord.** Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. All: **It is right and just.**










The Lord's Prayer: (recite together)

Lamb of God: (sung by all)




