



The right hand of the Lord has shown its power; (f) the right hand of the Lord has raised me UP.


- Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love en-<u>dures for</u> EV-er.

- 1 It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to <u>trust in</u> MOR-tals: it is better to take refuge in <u>the</u> LORD than to <u>trust in</u> PRINC-es. The nations all <u>en</u>-COM-passed me; in the lord's name I CRUSHED them.
- They compassed me, compassed me about; in the Lord's <u>name I</u> CRUSHED them.
 They compassed me about <u>like</u> BEES; they blazed like a fire <u>a-mong</u> THORNS.





From the waters of the flood you saved Noah through the ark, from the waters of baptism raise up to new life those under instruction.


