

ANTIPHON: (cantor/all)



 I shall look down on my FOES. (cont.)






- It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to <u>trust in</u> MOR-tals:

- I was hard-pressed and was falling but the Lord <u>came to</u> HELP me.



- (d) praiseworthy and exalted above <u>all for</u>-EV-er. (cont.)






- Blessed are you in the firma-<u>ment of</u> HEA-ven, praiseworthy and glori-<u>ous for</u>-EV-er.




Romans 13: 11-12






