



### **ANTIPHON**: (cantor/all)

He shall sit upon the throne of David

- (c) and rule over his kingdom for ever,/ <u>al-le</u>-LU-ia!"
- The Lord's revelation to my Master:
   "Sit <u>on my</u> RIGHT:
   your foes I will put be-<u>neath your</u> FEET."
- 2 The Lord will wield from Zion your scep-<u>ter of</u> POW-er, rule in the midst of <u>all your</u> FOES.
- A prince from the day of your birth on the <u>ho-ly</u> MOUN-tain; from the womb before the dawn <u>l be</u>-GOT you.

  a priest like Melchize-<u>dek of</u> OLD." (cont.)






- 1 The Master standing at your right hand will <u>shat-ter</u> KINGS in the day of <u>his great</u> WRATH.

**ANTIPHON**: (cantor/all)

- (d) I will bless your NAME for-EVER.
- I will bless you day af-<u>ter</u> DAY and praise your name <u>for</u> EV-er. The Lord is great, highly to <u>be</u> PRAISED, his greatness can-NOT be MEAS-ured.
- Age to age shall proclaim <u>your</u> WORKS, shall declare your might-<u>ty</u> DEEDS, shall speak of your splendor <u>and</u> GLO-ry, tell the tale of your WOND-erful WORKS.
- They shall speak of your terri-<u>ble</u> DEEDS, recount your greatness <u>and</u> MIGHT.


# Reading


# Magnificat: (please stand)


# Intercessions

### all respond: May your kingdom come, O Lord.


