**Invitatory:** *(please stand)*

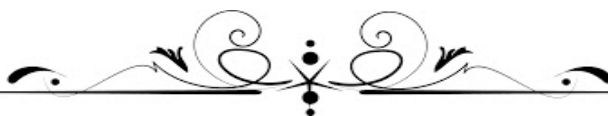
*All make the sign of the cross as the Priest intones:*

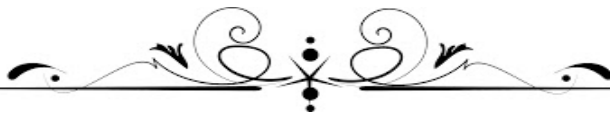

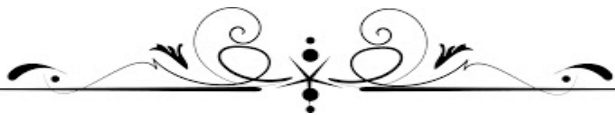
## Psalm 145

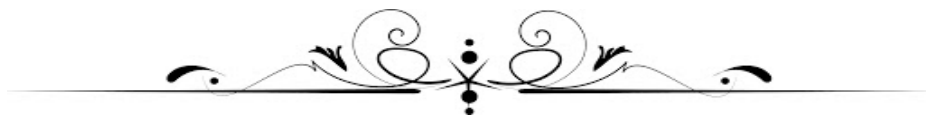

Alleluia, Al-le-LU-ia!





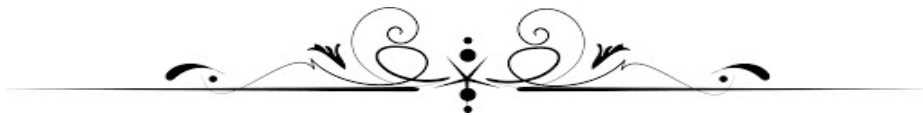



From this day all generations will call me BLESSED.

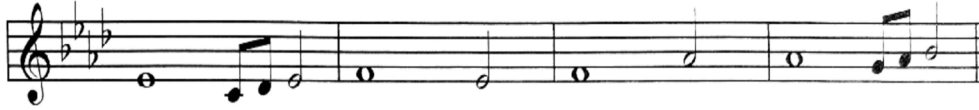
2 The Almighty has done great THINGS for me,

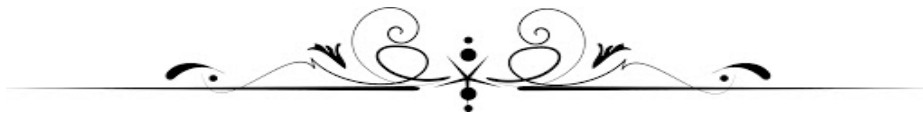
## Intercessions

*all respond: **May your kingdom come, O Lord.***

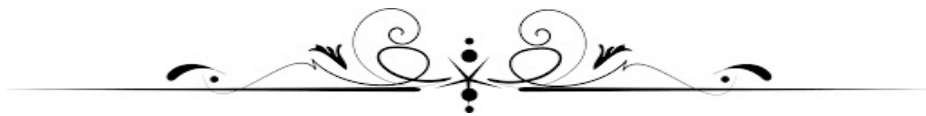
