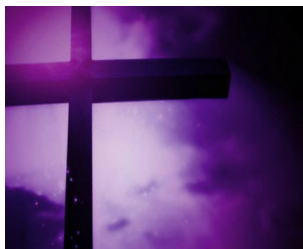

By his wounds you were HEALED.

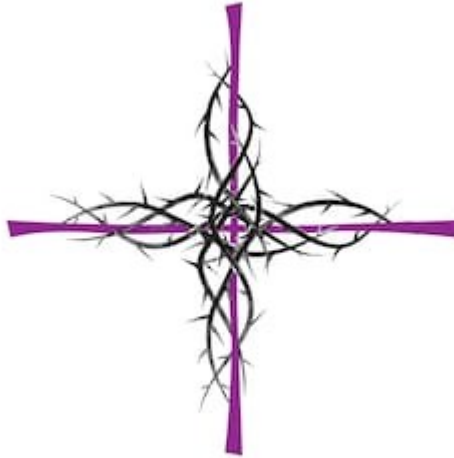

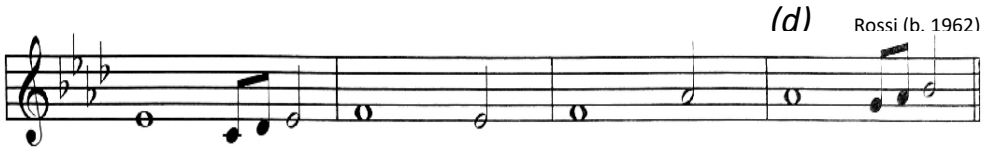
