

FIRST PART: THE SOLEMN BEGINNING OF THE VIGIL

(Lucernarium)

The Blessing of the Fire and Preparation of the Candle

A large fire is prepared in a suitable place. The people and the Priest assemble there with the other ministers (carrying the paschal candle). The Priest then gree(s the assembly in the usual manner and briefly instructs them about the vigil and blesses the fire.

Dear brethren (brothers and sisters),...Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

To stress the dignity and significance of the paschal candle, the following rite is done.

After the blessing of the new fire, the Priest cuts a cross into the candle with a stylus. Then he traces the Greek letter Alpha above the cross, the letter Omega below, and the numerals of the current year between the arms of the cross. While doing this he says:

. Christ yesterday and today; $m{m{m{m{m{m{m{m{A}}}}}}}$		A .

When the cross and other marks have been made, the Priest may insert five grains of incense in the candle. He does this in the form of a cross saying:

The Priest lights the paschal candle from the new fire, saying:

May the light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.



Procession

One of the ministers takes burning coals from the fire and places them in the thurible; the Priest then places incense into it. The Deacon, or other appropriate minister, accepts the paschal candle from the Priest, and a procession is formed. The Priest and ministers follow the smoking thurible and lit paschal candle, leading the people, who are holding unlit candles, to the door of the church. At the door of the darkened church, the Deacon then takes the Easter candle, lifts it high, and sings:



After this, the Priest lights his candle. When the procession reaches the middle of the church, the Deacon lifts the candle high and sings a second time:

The Light of Christ. Thanks be to God.


All light their candles from the paschal candle and the procession continues. When the Deacon arrives before the altar, he faces the people and sings a third time:

The Light of Christ. Thanks be to God.

After the paschal candle is placed in a large candle holder, the lights in the church are put on, except for the altar candles.

The Easter Proclamation (Exsultet)

The Easter Proclamation is proclaimed by the Deacon or, in his absence, by the Priest. If necessary, a lay cantor may sing the Proclamation. In this case, the words "Therefore, dearest friends" up to the end of the invitation are omitted, as is the greeting "The Lord be with you." All stand and hold lighted candles.



Christ's death is death to sin once and for all, and his life is life for God. We are dead to sin and living for God in Christ.





Responsorial Psalm/Alleluia: (cantor/all)

(all repeat refrain)

Vs. 2: "The right hand of the Lord has struck with power;

(all repeat refrain)

Vs. 3: The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.

Before the Gospel, the Priest/Deacon says, "The Lord be with you," and all respond:

And with your spirit.

Before Priest/Deacon says, "A reading from the Holy Gospel according to N"., and all respond: Glory to you, O Lord.

After the Gospel reading, the Priest/Deacon says, "The Gospel of the Lord," and all respond: **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

Homily

THIRD PART: BAPTISMAL LITURGY

Following the homily, the Deacon or another minister calls the candidates for Baptism and their godparents forth from the assembly. The invitation to prayer and the Litany of the Saints follow. The Priest addresses the assembly with the following or similar words:

Dearly beloved,...

...all his merciful help.

If the font is to be blessed, but no one is to be baptized:

Dearly beloved,...

...may be numbered among the children of adoption in Christ.

When there are no Baptisms and the font is not to be blessed, the Litany of the Saints is omitted and the Blessing of Water takes place at once (page 81).

The singing of the Litany of the Saints is led by two cantors, with all standing, and may include, at the proper place, names of some saints, especially the titular saint of the church and the patron saints of the place and of those to be baptized.





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If there are candidates to be baptized, the Priest says the following prayer:

Almighty ever-living God,...

...Through Christ our Lord.

Amen.



Blessing of Baptismal Water

The Priest then blesses the water that will be used for Baptism,

O God, who by invisible power...

...through water and the Holy Spirit.

If appropriate, the Priest lowers the paschal candle into the water once or three times, continuing:

May the power of the Holy Spirit,...

...into the fullness of this font,

Holding the candle in the water, he continues:

so that all who have been buried with Christ...

...God, for ever and ever.

Amen.

Then the candle is lifted out of the water, and the people sing the following:

Renunciation of Sin and Profession of Faith

If there are baptismal candidates, the Priest, in a series of questions to which the candidates reply, "I do," asks the candidates to renounce sin and profess their faith.

Baptism

Immediately after his or her profession of faith, the Priest baptizes each candidate either by a threefold immersion or pouring of water using these words:

N., I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.



Anointing After Baptism

If the Confirmation of those baptized is separated from their Baptism*, the Priest anoints them immediately after Baptism. The Priest says the following words over the newly baptized before they are anointed:

The God of power and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ... ...who is Priest, Prophet, and King. **Amen.**

Clothing with a Baptismal Garment

The newly baptized are now clothed with baptismal garments (this rite is optional and may be omitted). The Priest says the following formulary, and at the words "Receive this baptismal garment," the godparents place the garment on the newly baptized.

N. and N., you have become a new creation... ...so that you may have everlasting life. **Amen.**

Presentation of a Lighted Candle

The Priest takes the paschal candle in his hands or touches it, saying:

Godparents, please come forward to give to the newly baptized the light of Christ.

A godparent of each of the newly baptized goes to the Priest, lights a candle from the paschal candle, then presents it to the newly baptized. Then the Priest says to the newly baptized:

You have been enlightened by Christ....

...with all the Saints in the heavenly kingdom.

Amen.



The Renewal of Baptismal Promises

When the Rite of Baptism (and Confirmation) has been completed or, if this has not taken place, after the Blessing of Water, all stand, holding lighted candles in their hands, and renew the promise of baptismal faith, unless this has already been done together with those to be baptized.

The Priest addresses the faithful in these or similar words:

Dear brethren (brothers and sisters), through the Paschal Mystery... ...and promised to serve God in the holy Catholic Church. And so I ask you:

Do you renounce Satan?

I do.

And all his works?

I do.

And all his empty show?

The Priest continues:

Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth? I do.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried. rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father?

I do.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting? I do.

And the Priest concludes:

And may almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,... ...for eternal life.

Amen.



CELEBRATION OF RECEPTION

The Priest invites the candidates for reception, along with their sponsors, to come into the sanctuary and before the community to make a profession of faith.

N., of your own free will...

...the sign of the Church's unity.

When the candidates and their sponsors have taken their places, the Priest asks the candidates to make the following profession of faith.

I believe and profess all that the holy Catholic Church believes, teaches, and proclaims to be revealed by God.

Then the candidates with their sponsors go individually to the Priest, who says to each candidate (laying his right hand on the head of any candidate who is not to receive confirmation):

N., the Lord receives you into the Catholic Church....

...in the faith that you have professed in the presence of his family.

CELEBRATION OF CONFIRMATION

The newly baptized with their godparents and, if they have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation, the newly received with their sponsors, now stand before the Priest. He addresses them with these or similar words:

My dear newly baptized,...

...and to build up the Body of Christ in faith and love.

The Priest then addresses the rest of the assembly.

My dear friends,...-

...and anoint them to be more like Christ, the Son of God.

All pray briefly in silence.

The Priest holds his hands outstretched over the entire group of those to be confirmed and says the following prayer.

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,...

...Through Christ our Lord.

Amen.

Each candidate, with godparents or sponsors, goes to the Priest (or, if circumstances require it, the Priest may go to the candidates). Either or both godparents and sponsors place the right hand on the shoulder of the candidate; a godparent or a sponsor gives the candidate's name to the minister of the sacrament. The minister anoints each candidate using these words:

N., be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Peace be with you.

And with your spirit.

The Priest says the prayer over the gifts, following this, the people respond:

Amen

The Eucharistic Prayer/Preface

The Eucharistic Prayer begins with a dialogue between the Priest and the assembly.


Priest: The Lord be with you. All: And with your spirit.






The Lord's Prayer: (recite together)

Lamb of God: (sung by all)




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After the Priest says, "Behold the Lamb of God,... called to the supper of the Lamb." the people respond:

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Communion Choral Anthem


