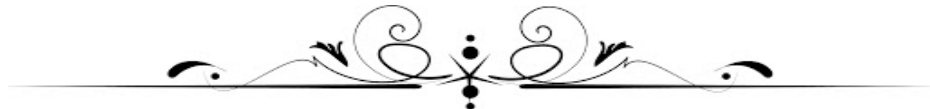

Invitatory: *(please stand)*

All make the sign of the cross as the Priest intones:

age to age shall ring OUT your JUS-tice. (*cont.*)

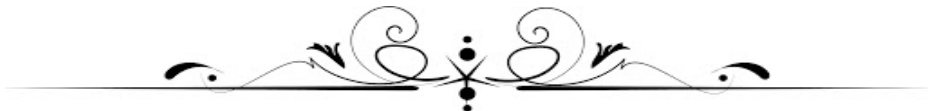

Intercessions

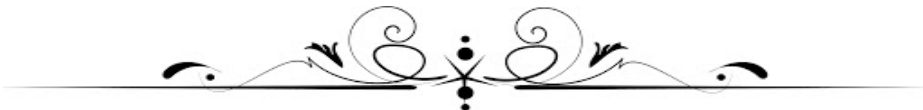
Christ invites all to the supper in which he gives his Body and Blood for the world. Let us pray:

all respond: Christ, the bread of heaven, grant us everlasting life.

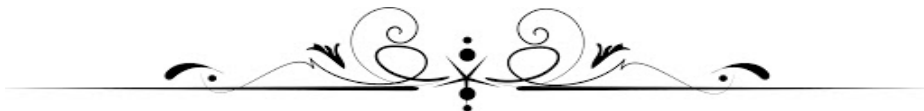
Christ, through your bread you offer the remedy of immortality and the pledge of future resurrection, restore health to the sick and hope to sinners.

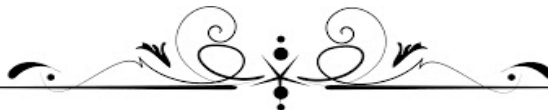
