but to us he has GIV-en the EARTH. (cont.)



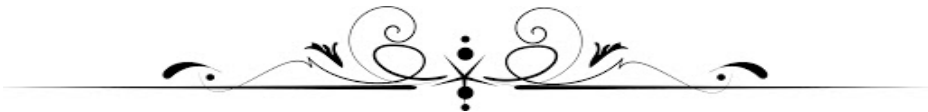
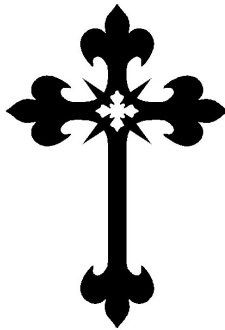

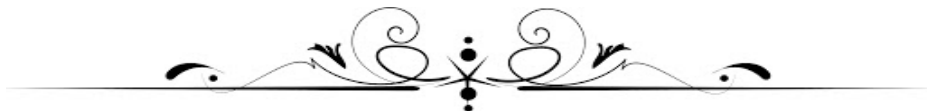
## Intercessions
