



t this supper on the night he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus, loving those who were his own in the world even to the end, offered his body and blood to the Father under the appearances of bread and wine, gave them to the apostles to eat and drink, then enjoined the apostles and their successors in the priesthood to offer them in turn. This Mass is, is first of all, the memorial of the institution of the Eucharist, that is of the memorial of the Lord's Passover, by which under sacramental signs he perpetuated among us the sacrifice of the New Law.





And with your spirit.


Before Priest/Deacon says, "A reading from the Holy Gospel according to N"., and all respond: **Glory to you, O Lord.**

After the Gospel reading, the Priest/Deacon says, "The Gospel of the Lord," and all respond: **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

HOMILY

MANDATUM (THE WASHING OF FEET) (CHOIR/ALL)

The homily is followed by the washing of feet, the mandatum (from the Latin word for "command": "A new commandment I give to you..."). This is a simple gesture of humble service: the bishop, assisted by the deacon, washes the feet of various members of the congregation. During this rite the following anthem is sung by the choir joined by the congregation.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER/PREFACE


The Eucharistic Prayer begins with a dialogue between the Priest and the assembly.








THE TRANSFER OF THE MOST BLESSED SACRAMENT


fter the Prayer After Communion, the Bishop puts incense in the thurible and incenses the Blessed Sacrament, during which time the congregation kneels. As the Blessed Sacrament is carried in procession through the church to the place of repose, all chant PANGE LINGUA. The faithful are invited to continue adoration before the Blessed Sacrament until 8:00 PM in the Saint Peter Cathedral Crypt. Please kneel following the PANGE LINGUA for a few moments until one of the clergy announces the Holy Thursday Mass has concluded. The Paschal Fast begins.
